

RANDOLPH COUNTY COMMISSION MINUTES
April 10, 2007

The Honorable Commission convened at the Huntsville Courthouse with the following present: Susan Carter, Presiding Commissioner, Randy Asbury, Western District Commissioner, and Nancy Copenhaver, Deputy Clerk. Doug Galaske, Easter District Commissioner was not present as he was attending a three-day emergency management training. He joined the meeting during the noon hour.

9:05 a.m., Com. Carter called the meeting to order. Com. Asbury moved, Com. Carter seconded approval of the agenda; motion carried (2-0).

Bill Dougherty came in. Com. Carter reported she received a request from Kevin Bartholemy for grading on CR 1355.

Melva Owens from NECAC called, requesting a signature on one page of the document sent earlier.

Com. Asbury and Mr. Dougherty discussed bridges on CR 2270, also known as Seven Bridges Road, which is in the Moberly Special Road District.

Carol Summers, payroll clerk, came in with a replacement check to be signed.

Billy Reid communicated that the speed limit signs approved earlier by the Commission have not been installed.

Commissioners discussed Bill Luntsford's offer to purchase part of the old County Farm. They called Mr. Luntsford, explained about the earlier commitment made to the Huntsville Historical Society, and noted that they can't accept his offer right now. They will get back to him.

10:05 a.m., the fuel bid was awarded to Brownfield Oil for April 11-17 for \$2,359, with MFA bidding \$2,365.

Mary Sue Bragg called to report a culvert caved in on CR 1620. She was concerned that it might cause problems for a motorist.

10:40 a.m., the Commissioners studied the invoices presented for payment. Checks 3260-3322 were signed for payment of approved invoices from the following funds: General Revenue \$9,118.60; LE Trng. \$802.50; Assmt \$1,017.17; Road and Bridge \$24,325.17; User \$61.10; LEPC \$189.00; E911 \$57.90; PA Grant \$202.80 and JC \$22,649.78. Total amount of checks:\$58,424.11

10:45 a.m., Sheriff Mark Nichols called, noting that he has surplus light bars he would like to have declared surplus property. Several rural fire departments have expressed interest in buying them. He will come to the April 12 meeting and bring specifics on the lights. He will get information of training modules for Com Carter and Com. Asbury for the emergency management training. Sheriff Nichols also pointed out that the mulch in the flowerbeds looks bad. He would like to rent a tiller and plant it in grass, making it easier to maintain. This will also be on the April 12 agenda when Sheriff Nichols comes in for his quarterly budget review.

11:20 a.m., Com. Carter moved, Com. Asbury seconded approval of the invoices presented for payment; motion carried (2-0) and checks were signed.

11:35 a.m., Michael Purol called, asking to be on the agenda for April 17. He will bring bridge estimates and costs for occasional engineering consulting fees. Com. Carter called Dee Vanderburg to be sure he got her message, and left another message.

11:40 a.m., Commissioners read and handled correspondence. They received notification by certified mail from U.S. Cable of rate and channel changes.

The Commission received notice from FEMA announcing that Randolph County has been officially approved for participation in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP).

11:45 a.m. County Clerk Jim Sears brought in checks to be signed for election workers.

12:10 p.m., Com. Galaske arrived and Com. Carter updated him briefly on the morning's business.

12:30 p.m., Com. Galaske moved/Com. Carter seconded approval of the minutes of April 5 with corrections; motion carried (3-0). Com. Carter said she plans to set up a meeting with Moberly City Manager Gary Edwards and the new Moberly mayor in the near future.

12:40 p.m., Com. Galaske left the meeting to return to his training session.

1:00 p.m., the meeting recessed so Commissioners Asbury and Carter could join Road and Bridge Supervisor Bill Dougherty on a site survey of damaged road complaints.

2:30 p.m., the Commission reconvened after viewing the site of a complaint against a private citizen grading CR 1720; they will discuss this next week with Com. Galaske.

2:40 p.m., Assessor Richard Tregnago stopped in to discuss how he assesses mobile homes.

3:00 p.m., meeting adjourned.
