

**RANDOLPH COUNTY COMMISSION MINUTES**  
**Thursday, April 22, 2010**

The Honorable Commission convened at the Huntsville Courthouse with the following present: Susan Carter, Presiding Commissioner; Wayne Wilcox, Eastern District Commissioner; Randy Asbury, Western District Commissioner and Deputy Clerk, Erin Denney.

**9:00 a.m.**, Com. Carter called the meeting to order and moved approval of the agenda. Com. Asbury seconded, motion passed (3-0).

Com. Wilcox reported that he dropped off a bucket of approved gravel to be analyzed at Norris Aggregate Products at the Randolph County Quarry.

**9:10 a.m.**, Road and Bridge Supervisor Bill Dougherty arrived to discuss County roads.

Commissioners signed a contract for work done for Higbee to receive use of the County grader for 3 hours at \$65.00 per hour for a maximum of 40 hours.

Commissioners reviewed correspondence. Commissioners received a workman's compensation report from the Missouri Association of Counties.

Com. Carter left a message for Lonnie Von Thum, Dust Solutions, requesting pricing for reapplication of tree sap on CR2788 near Clark.

Commissioners reviewed minutes from April 18<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup>. Com. Asbury moved to approve minutes with changes. Com. Wilcox seconded, motion passed (3-0).

**10:30 a.m.**, Northeast Community Action Committee Representatives (NECAC) Patsy Redding, Randolph County Service Coordinator, Janice Robinson, Deputy Director for Community Services, and Dave Towne, Public Information Officer, arrived to receive the signed Proclamation declaring May as Community Action Month.

**10:45 a.m.**, Chanda Bankhead, Juvenile Office Director, stopped in to drop off the finalized contract between Randolph County and the Bruce Normile Juvenile Justice Center for signature.

Com. Asbury called Tom Ridgeway, CR2420, to inform him that a culvert was to be installed at the location where drainage is a problem.

Commissioners contacted State Representatives and Senators voicing opposition to Senate Bill 1014, which would force counties to house non-violent state criminals, as well as proposed legislation to reduce prisoner per diem reimbursement and reduced assessment parcel reimbursement.

**12:40 p.m.**, Commissioners were contacted by Moberly Monitor Index Reporter Ben Herrold for the weekly news conference.

**1:15 p.m.**, Meeting adjourned so Com. Wilcox and Com. Asbury could join Road and Bridge Supervisor Bill Dougherty to inspect trees that need to be trimmed for the CR1660 reclaiming project. Additionally, Com. Carter will be attending the 911 Joint-Commission meeting at 2:00 p.m., in Moberly.
