

RANDOLPH COUNTY COMMISSION MINUTES
Thursday June 3, 2010

The Honorable Commission convened at the Huntsville Courthouse with the following present: Susan Carter, Presiding Commissioner; Wayne Wilcox, Eastern District Commissioner; Randy Asbury, Western District Commissioner and Deputy Clerk, Erin Denney.

9:00 a.m., Com. Carter called the meeting to order and moved approval of the agenda. Com. Asbury seconded, motion passed (3-0).

Com. Carter received a call from Greg Wilson, President of Holiday Acres Home Association, regarding final plans for the reclaiming project on CR1660 to begin on Monday.

9:40 a.m., Road and Bridge Supervisor Bill Dougherty arrived to discuss road maintenance.

Commissioners reviewed invoices for payment. Com. Wilcox moved to approve all invoices as presented. Com. Asbury seconded, motion passed (3-0) and checks were signed.

Checks 1484-1511 were signed for payment of approved invoices for the following funds: General Revenue \$1,528.77; Assmt \$523.80; Road & Bridge \$10,725.10 and JC \$1,780.20 Total amount of checks: \$14,557.87.

10:00 a.m., Rick Howard, Maintenance, arrived to drop off his list of maintenance procedures to be referred to in his absent as requested by the Commission.

10:30 a.m., Ross McKinstry, Randolph County Health Department, and Brian Williams, Caring Community, arrived to discuss funding needs of the Magic City Express Public Transportation System.

Commissioners called Mr. Dougherty to report Coroner Gerald Luntsford's request for maintenance on CR1960 and removal of several tractor trailers on CR1960 right of way.

12:30 p.m., Lee Spangler, Custodian, arrived to discuss trash pick up for the Huntsville Courthouse. Mr. Spangler suggested it would be more efficient if he transported trash to the County dumpster at the Justice Center saving the cost of City pick-up. Mr. Spangler reported that he enjoyed the EPM training meeting this morning and found it very informational.

1:30 p.m., Com. Wilcox left to pick up two buckets of rock samples from the quarry for the CR1660 project.

Com. Asbury received a call from Sheila Huddelston, SEMA, regarding funding assistance for the proposed Cairo Highway 63 Access Road. Mrs. Huddelston reported that SEMA has no moneys available.


1:53 p.m., Com. Wilcox returned to the meeting with two rock samples from which to choose for the CR1660 project.
