

RANDOLPH COUNTY COMMISSION MINUTES

Tuesday, March 15, 2011

The Honorable Commission convened at the Huntsville Courthouse with the following present: Susan Carter, Presiding Commissioner; Wayne Wilcox, Eastern District Commissioner, Jerry Crutchfield, Western District Commissioner, and Tara McPherson, Deputy Clerk.

9:00 a.m. Com. Carter called the meeting to order and moved approval of the agenda. Com. Crutchfield seconded and motion passed (3-0).

9:30 a.m. Bob Holtshaus, Missouri Association of Counties, arrived for a review of the county's Workman's Compensation and suggested changes to county personnel policies. County Clerk Will Ellis was also present for the meeting.

11:00 a.m. The weekly fuel bid was awarded to Wright's Oil & Propane Inc. at 3.195. MFA Oil bid at 3.25 and Brownfield Oil bid at 3.219.

11:50 a.m. Following review, Com. Wilcox made a motion to approve invoices for payment as presented. Com. Carter seconded, motion passed (3-0) and checks were signed.

Com. Carter contacted Circuit Clerk Peggy Boots requesting more complete documentation from Special Prosecutor Milt Harper before approving his \$10,350.00 invoice for re-investigating the city of Moberly Taser incident.

County Clerk Will Ellis arrived to discuss the Special Road District's dispersal of tax funds. He also reported that this week the county will be switching from Touch Tone for long distance to Chariton Valley.

Doug Sharp arrived to observe the meeting.

Commissioners received notice from Rick Howard, Maintenance, stating that he will be off on Thursday March 31, 2011 and Friday April 1, 2011.

12:20 p.m. Com. Wilcox received a phone call from Mid-Missouri Limestone Inc.

Com Wilcox reported on a phone call received Friday from Gary Kribbs, CR 2755, who had concerns about quality of gravel. He reported the he had multiple tires damaged with flint rock on CR 2759. Investigation found Mid-Missouri Limestone Inc. was the supplier of the rock on the road. Com. Wilcox contacted the manager who would like to see a sample of the rock.

Commissioners handled correspondence.

Com. Carter received a phone call from Andy Morris, Moberly City Manager, concerning ownership of the Moberly Courthouse. The city determined that they and the county each have an undivided half interest in the property.

Road and Bridge Supervisor Mike Rogers arrived with maintenance updates. They discussed rotating grader operators to different work zones.

Com Wilcox reported on a phone call received on Friday about CR 2769 from Mose G. Borntreger requesting someone to inspect his driveway for the installation of a culvert. Com. Wilcox informed Mr. Borntreger that the county could install it since they maintain the road, but would not purchase the rock needed.

Laura Snelling, Chariton Valley, arrived to update the Commission on the installation of the new phone system for the county which could be completed earlier than promised.

1:10 p.m. Com. Crutchfield received a phone call from Greg Smith, CR 1230, concerning drainage issues along this road and wants to discuss them with the county. He was referred to Road and Bridge Supervisor Mike Rogers.

1:30 p.m. Commissioners called Attorney Ivan Schraeder. They discussed recently condemned Kansas City Southern bridge on CR 2580 and possible solutions to reopening the bridge.

Jim Steinhauser arrived to inspect brickwork on the courthouse for an estimate on repair costs.

2:45 p.m. Com. Carter left the meeting.



4:00 p.m. Meeting adjourned.




